These reflect the everyday life and experiences of the people. The Tribal folk culture reflects its distinctive lifestyle. Tribal cultures often retain ancient practices and knowledge systems passed on from one generation to other, thus forming a rich heritage.

Folk and tribal cultures of the north East India are an integral part of the cultural landscape and they provide scope to the richness of human expression in the region. Every tribe in the North East India has its folk culture which is the means for its sustenance as an ethnic identity. It is well known that tribes in the region have unique cultural traits and philosophical view of their world through their folklore. Oral narratives act as both ontology and epistemology in Indigenous knowledge system. On the one hand, it is very pertinent to understand, document and preserve the folk culture of the tribes in the region. On the other hand, folk culture of the tribes is the store house of knowledge which needs to be analyzed and interpreted in order to know the tribes, their nature and their way of life.

But at present, due to The forces of modernization like industrialization, urbanization, liberalization, privatization, globalization, expansion of education, improved transportation network, technological advancement, etc., most of the tribal youth in the region are ignoring their folk culture which is a big sign of cultural decline. Therefore, it becomes necessary that special efforts should be made to save the folk culture of the tribes of the region. On the other hand, it is a fact that time has its imprint on everything. Hence, the refinement in the folk culture of the tribes in the region must be monitored only to the extent that it does not harm the originality.
