CONCEPT NOTE

Understanding women's position in a given society can be marked as a crucial part of contemporary researches which seek to re-examine and re-define the myths and stereotypes associated with the subject. New readings of the way the role and status of a woman in patriarchal societies have been recognized and represented show how women have been discriminated and granted a marginalized position throughout history.

Pythagoras, the renowned founder of Pythagorean concept, stated: "There is a good principle which created order, light, and man, and an evil principle which created chaos, darkness, and woman". Pythagoras has been quoted by Simone de Beauvoir, the French feminist critic, in her book, *The Second Sex* (1949), to show how the biased and prejudiced custom of positioning women in the margin must be addressed as a longstanding ingrained problem.

Women, all over the world, have been treated unequally on various grounds. Examples of women's struggles even for basic rights are numerous. Even though the endeavors to secure equal shares for women in the orientation of power relations have been rewarding to a certain extent in introducing reforms in social, cultural, and political modes of locating a woman's individuality, there is still much to be done. Although the lived experiences of Indian women are different in many aspects, they also fight oppression (both mental and physical) and discrimination resulting from the patriarchal gender norms. But the diverse and distinct circumstances that create the socio-cultural ambience of an Indian woman make the issue a complex one which requires specific means for addressing the problem.

Gayatri Chakravorty Spivak, in her essay called "Three Women's Texts and a Critique of Imperialism", critically looks at the Western *feminist* lens as an inadequate framework to be applied in the context of a *Third World* country. The National Seminar, "Indian Society and Women: Perspectives on Past, Present and Future", proposed by the Department of English, Bongaigaon University, will provide scholars with a medium to shed lights on unique features of Indian society which condition the existence of women.
